BEWARE OF KNOCKOFFS



•For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and perform great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect. (Mt 24:24, NIV)



WORTH MORE THAN ANYTHING



•45 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. 46 When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it. (Mt 13:45-46, NIV)



BEWARE OF KNOCKOFFS



•"Watch out for false prophets. They come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ferocious wolves. (Mt 7:15, NIV)



CONTEXT



• 31 When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and with all the angels with Him, then He will sit on the [royal] throne of His glory. 32 And all the peoples will be gathered before Him, and He will separate them from one another, just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. 33 And He will place the sheep on His right and the goats on the left. 34 Then the King will say to those on His right, "Come you who have been blessed by my Father, inherit the **Kingdom** that has been prepared for you from the foundation of the world. (Mt 25:31-34, AT)



CONTEXT



• For I was [1] hungry, and you gave Me something to eat; I was [2] thirsty, and you gave Me something to drink, I was a [3] stranger, and you welcomed Me as a guest; [4] inadequately clothed [lit. naked], and you clothed Me; I was [5] sick, and you visited Me [to care for me]; I was [6] in prison, and you came to Me [to visit]. (Mt 25:35-36, AT)



CONTEXT



• 37 Then the righteous will reply to Him, "Lord, when(ever) did we see you when you were [1] hungry and feed you, or when(ever) were you [2] thirsty and we gave you something to drink? 38 And when(ever) did we see you [as] a [3] stranger, and welcome you as a guest; or [4] inadequately clothed, and we clothed you? 39 And when(ever) did we see you when you were [5] sick or [6] in prison, and we came (to visit) you? (Mt 25:37-39, AT)





•And replying, the King will say to them, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least [ἐλάχιστος | elachistos] of these brothers and sisters of Mine, you did for Me." (Mt 25:40, AT)





Whoever is kind to the **poor** lends to the LORD [YHWH], and he will **reward** them for what they have done.

(Pr 19:17, NIV)





•For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will **reward** each person according to **what they have done**. (Mt 16:27, NIV)





•"Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son and they shall call Him by the name, Immanuel" (which is translated, "God With Us"). (Mt 1:23, NIV)





•For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them."
(Mt 18:20, NIV)





• 18 And having come near, Jesus spoke to them saying, "All authority in heaven and on the earth has been given to Me." 19 Go, therefore, [and] make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And, listen: I am with you always – until the consummation of the age. (Mt 28:18-20, AT)





 Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in your midst? (1 Cor 3:16, NIV)





•19 Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; 20 you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies. (1 Cor 6:19-20, NIV)





• You, however, are not in the realm of the flesh but are in the realm of the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, they do not belong to Christ. (Rom 8:9, NIV)





• 24 Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. 25 For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. 26 What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? (Mt 16:24-26, NIV)





•For whoever is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when He comes in His Father's glory with the holy angels. (Mk 8:38, AT)





•For the Son of Man is going to come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then he will **reward** each person according to what they have done. (Mt 16:27, NIV)





•Jesus answered, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." (Mt 19:21, NIV)





- Adjective: $\mu \kappa \rho \delta \varsigma (mikros) = small or little,$
- Comparative: ἐλάσσων (elasson) = smaller or littler
- Superlative: ἐλάχιστος (elachistos) =
 smallest or least





•Truly I tell you, among those born of women there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist; yet whoever is least [μικρός | mikros in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. (Mt 11:11, NIV)






•6 "If anyone causes one of these little ones [μικρός | mikros] —those who believe in me—to stumble, it would be better for them to have a large millstone hung around their neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea (Mt 18:6, NIV)





• 7 Woe to the world because of the things that cause people to stumble! Such things must come, but woe to the person through whom they come! 8 If your hand or your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life maimed or crippled than to have two hands or two feet and be thrown into eternal fire. 9 And if your eye causes you to stumble, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to enter life with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into the fire of hell. (Mt 18:7-9, NIV)







•See that you do not despise one of these **little ones** [μικρός | *mikros*]

...(Mt 18:10a, NIV)





•In the same way your Father in heaven is not willing that any of these little ones [μικρός | mikros] should perish. (Mt 18:14, NIV)



MATTHEW 25:40 BROTHERS AND SISTERS OF/IN CHRIST



• 46 While Jesus was still talking to the crowd, his mother and brothers stood outside, wanting to speak to him. 47 Someone told him, "Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you." 48 He replied to him, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" 49 Pointing to his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. 50 For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." (Mt 12:46-50, NIV)

•Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." (Mt 28:10, NIV)



MATTHEW 25:40 BROTHERS AND SISTERS OF/IN CHRIST



•Both the one who makes people holy and those who are made holy are of the same family. So Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters. (Heb 2:11, NIV)





•9 "Do not get any gold or silver or copper to take with you in your belts—10 no bag for the journey or extra shirt or sandals or a staff, for the worker is worth his keep. 11 Whatever town or village you enter, search there for some worthy person and stay at their house until you leave. (Mt 10:9-11, NIV)





• 12 As you enter the home, give it your greeting. 13 If the home is deserving, let your peace rest on it; if it is not, let your peace return to you. 14 If anyone will not welcome you or listen to your words, leave that home or town and shake the dust off your feet. 15 Truly I tell you, it will be more bearable for Sodom and Gomorrah on the day of judgment than for that town. (Mt 10:12-15, NIV)





• 16 "I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves. 17 Be on your guard; you will be handed over to the local councils and be flogged in the synagogues. 18 On my account you will be brought before governors and kings as witnesses to them and to the Gentiles (Mt 10:16-18, NIV)





• 23 Are they servants of Christ? (I am out of my mind to talk like this.) I am more. I have worked much harder, been in [6] **prison** more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been [5] exposed to death again and again. 24 Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. 25 Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was pelted with stones, three times I was shipwrecked, I spent a night and a day in the open sea, (2 Cor 11:23-25, NIV)





• 26 I have been constantly on the move. [3] I have been in danger from rivers, in danger from bandits, in danger from my fellow Jews, in danger from Gentiles; in danger in the city, in danger in the country, in danger at sea; and in danger from false believers. 27 I have labored and toiled and have often gone without sleep; I have known [1] **hunger** and [2] **thirst** and have often gone without food; I have been cold and [4] naked (2 Co 11:26-27, NIV)





• 40 "Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me, and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. 41 Whoever welcomes a prophet as a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever welcomes a righteous person as a righteous person will receive a righteous person's reward. 42 And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones [μικρός] mikros] who is my disciple, truly I tell you, that person will certainly not lose their reward." (Mt 10:40-42, NIV)





 Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. He went to the high priest 2 and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem. (Ac 9:1-2, NIV)





- 3 As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. 4 He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute **me**?" 5 "Who are **you**, Lord?" Saul asked.
- "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied.

· Very truly I tell you, whoever accepts anyone I send accepts me; and whoever accepts me accepts the one who sent me." (Jn 13:20, NIV)



MATTHEW 25:40 FAITHFUL, FRUITFUL FOLLOWERS



•5 he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, (Ti 3:5-6, NIV)





•I told you that you would die in your sins; if you do not believe that I am he, you will indeed die in your sins." (Jn 8:24, NIV)





 Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever rejects the Son will not see life, for God's wrath remains on them. (Jn 3:36, NIV)





•As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, (Eph 2:1, NIV)





•8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—9 not by works, so that no one can boast. 10 For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do (Eph 2:8-10, NIV)
