From that time on Jesus began to preach, "**Repent**, for the **kingdom of heaven** has **come near**."(Mt 4:17, NIV)




SERMON ON THE MOUNT CONTEXT



23 Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming **the good news** [εὐαγγέλιον | *euangelion*] **of the kingdom**, and healing every disease and sickness among the people. 24 News about him spread all over Syria, and people brought to him all who were ill with various diseases, those suffering severe pain, the demon-possessed, those having seizures, and the paralyzed; and he healed them. 25 Large crowds from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea and the region across the Jordan followed him. (Mt 4:23-25, NIV)

16 On the morning of the third day there was thunder and lightning, with a thick cloud over the mountain, and a very loud trumpet blast. Everyone in the camp trembled. 17 Then Moses led the people out of the camp to meet with God, and they stood at the foot of the mountain. 18 Mount Sinai was covered with smoke, because the LORD [YHWH] descended on it in fire. The smoke billowed up from it like **smoke from a furnace**, and the **whole** mountain trembled violently. 19 As the sound of the trumpet grew louder and louder, Moses spoke and the voice of God answered him. (Ex 19:16-19, NIV)

28 When Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were amazed at his teaching, 29 because he taught as one who had authority, and not as their teachers of the law. (Mt 7:28-29, NIV)

MATTHEW 5:3 BLESSINGS FIRST



I am the LORD [YHWH] your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. [lit. servants] (Ex 20:2, AT)



MATTHEW 5:3 BLESSINGS FIRST



Blessed [μακάριος | *makarios*] are the poor in spirit because the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs.
(Mt 5:3, AT I)



MATTHEW 5:3 BLESSINGS FIRST



The poor in spirit are blessed [μακάριος | makarios]
because the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs.
(Mt 5:3, AT II)





1 Blissful [Heb: אַשָׁרֵי 'ašrê], LXX: μακάριος | makarios] is the one who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked, or stand in the way of sinners, or dwell in the assembly of mockers, 2 but rather in the law of the LORD [YHWH] they delight, and on His law they meditate day and night.

(Ps 1:1-2, AT)





O taste and see that the LORD [YHWH] is good; **How blessed** [אַשְׁרֵי '*ašrê*] is the man who takes refuge in Him!

(Ps 34:8, NASB)





How blessed [אַשָּׁרֵי ' $a\check{s}r\hat{e}$] is the man who finds wisdom And the man who gains understanding.

(Pr 3:13, NASB)





1 Blessed [אַשְׁרֵי 'ašrê] is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.
2 Blessed [אַשְׁרֵי 'ašrê] is the one whose sin the LORD [YHWH] does not count against them

and in whose spirit is no deceit.

(Ps 32:1-2, NIV)





1 **Happy** [אַשְׁרֵי '*ašrê*] are those whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.

2 **Happy** [אַשְׁרֵי] *`ašrê*] are those to whom the LORD [YHWH] imputes no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

(Ps 32:1-2, NRSV)





1 **Blessed** [אַשְׁבֵי '*ašrê*] are all who fear the LORD [YHWH], who walk in obedience to him.

2 You will eat the fruit of your labor; **blessings** [אַשְׁבֵי '*ašrê*] and prosperity will be yours. (Ps 128:1-2, NIV)





- 1 **How happy** [אַשְׁרֵי '*ašrê*] is everyone who fears the LORD [YHWH], who walks in His ways!
- 2 You will surely eat what your hands have worked for.
 You will be happy [אַשְׁרֵי 'ašrê], and it will go well for you.
 (Ps 128:1-2, HCSB)





 Blessed [אַשְׁרֵי 'ašrê] are those whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the LORD [YHWH].
 Blessed [אַשְׁרֵי 'ašrê] are those who keep his statutes and seek him with all their heart—

(Ps 119:1-2, NIV)





Blessed [μακάριος | *makarios*] is the one who perseveres trial, because having been tested, they will receive the crown of life, which [the Lord] has promised to those who love Him. (Jas 1:12, AT)





Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; **blessed** [μακάριος | *makarios*] are those who have not seen and yet have believed." (Jn 20:29, NIV)





Jesus said, "Because you have seen Me, you have believed. Those who believe without seeing are **blessed** [μακάριος] makarios]." (Jn 20:29, HCSB)





16 Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

17 Jesus replied, "**Blessed** [μακάριος | *makarios*] are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. (Mt 16:16-17, NIV)





Looking at his disciples, he said:

"Blessed are you who are **poor**,

for yours is the kingdom of God. (Lk 6:20, NIV)





The Spirit of the Lord YHWH is on me, because The LORD [YHWH] has anointed me to proclaim good news to the **humble** $[\underline{v}]$ [' $\bar{a}n\bar{a}w$] He sent me to bind up the brokenhearted To proclaim liberty for the captives and the opening of the eyes of the imprisoned, (Is 61:1, AT)





(Now Moses was a very humble ענו) עַנוּ] 'ānāw] man, more humble [עַנו $\left[\hat{a}n\bar{a}w\right]$ than anyone else on the face of the earth.) (Num 12:3, NIV)





16 He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, 17 and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written:





18 "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news [εὐαγγελίζω | *euangelizō*] to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free,
19 to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."





20 Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it **back** to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. (Lk 4:16-20, NIV)





to proclaim the year of the LORD [YHWH]'s favor and the day of vengeance of our God,
to comfort all who mourn, (Is 61:2, NIV)





- 1 After Jesus had **finished instructing his twelve disciples**, he went on from there to teach and preach in the towns of Galilee.
- 2 When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples 3 to ask him, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?"
- (Mt 11:1-3, NIV)





4 Jesus replied, "Go back and report to John what you hear and see: 5 The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the **good news is proclaimed** [εὐαγγελίζω | *euangelizō*] to the **poor [see Is 61:1]**. 6 **Blessed** [μακάριος | *makarios*] is anyone who does not stumble on account of me." (Mt 11:4-6, NIV)





23 Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Truly I tell you, it is hard for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of heaven. 24 Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." (Mt 19:23-24, NIV)



MATTHEW 5:3 KINGDOM OF HEAVEN

Blessed are those who mourn [πενθέω | pentheō] because they will be comforted [by God].
(Mt 5:4, AT I)
Those who mourn are blessed

because they will be comforted [by God]. (Mt 5:4, AT II)





to proclaim the year of the LORD [YHWH]'s favor and the day of vengeance of our God,
to comfort all who mourn, (Is 61:2, NIV)





and provide for those who grieve in Zion to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of **righteousness**, a planting of the LORD [YHWH] for the display of his splendor. (Is 61:3, NIV)





Then young women will dance and be glad, young men and old as well.

- I will turn their mourning into gladness;
 - I will give them comfort and joy instead of sorrow.
- (Jer 31:13, NIV)





Streams of tears flow from my eyes, for your law is not obeyed.

(Ps 119:136, NIV)





Looking at his disciples, he said:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.(Lk 6:20, NIV)





1 Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. 2 Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the LORD [YHWH]'s hand double for all her sins. (Is 40:1-2, NIV)





3 A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD [YHWH]; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. 4 Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. (Is 40:3-4, NIV)





5 And the glory of the LORD [YHWH]will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the LORD [YHWH] has spoken."
(Is 40:5, NIV)





In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea 2 and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." (Mt 3:1-2, NIV)





This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah:

"A voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'" (Mt 3:3, NIV)





- For the Lamb at the center of the **throne**
 - will be their shepherd;
- 'he will lead them to springs of living water.'
 - 'And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'"
- (Rev 7:17, NIV)
