#### CONTEXT



And after leaving, straight away, the Pharisees began plotting against Him with the Herodians [concerning] how they might destroy Him. (Mk 3:6, AT)



#### CONTEXT



38 And He says to them, "Let's go elsewhere to the neighboring towns, so that there also I may preach. Because, for this reason I came out." 39 And He went into all of Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons. (Mk 1:38-39, AT)



#### MARK 2:1 JESUS IN THE HOUSE



And having gone into Capernaum again, after some days it was heard that He was at home. (Mk 2:1, AT)



#### MARK 2:2 PREACHING TO A PACKED HOUSE



And so many were gathered that they could no longer make room – not even by the door – and He was speaking the word to them. (Mk 2:2, AT)



#### MARK 2:2 PREACHING TO A PACKED HOUSE



14 Now after John was handed over [to be arrested], Jesus went into Galilee proclaiming the Gospel of God 15 and saying: "The [appointed] time has been fulfilled and the Kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe in the Gospel!" (Mk 1:14-15, AT)



MARK 2:3 GOOD FRIENDS!



## And some people come bringing to Him a paralyzed man, being carried by four of them. (Mk 2:3, AT)




MARK 2:4 TEAR THE ROOF OFF!



And not being able to bring [the man] to Him through the crowd, they remove [a part of] the roof where He was and, having dug through, they lower the mat where the paralyzed man was lying. (Mk 2:4, AT)







When they could not find a way to do this because of the crowd, they went up on the roof and lowered him on his mat through the tiles into the middle of the crowd, right in front of Jesus. (Lk 5:19, NIV)







And having seen their faith, Jesus says to the paralyzed man, "Child, your sins are forgiven." (Mk 2:5, AT)







1 As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. 2 His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" (Jn 9:1-2, NIV)





13 "When I shut up the heavens so that there is no rain, or command locusts to devour the land or send a plague among my people, 14 if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. (2 Ch 7:13-14, NIV)





He said, "If you listen carefully to the LORD [YHWH] your God and do what is right in his eyes, if you pay attention to his commands and keep all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for I am the LORD [YHWH], who heals you." (Ex 15:26, NIV)





If you pay attention to these laws and are careful to follow them, then the LORD [YHWH] your God will keep his covenant of love with you, as he swore to your ancestors. (Dt 7:12, NIV)

15 The LORD [YHWH] will keep you free from every disease. He will not inflict on you the horrible diseases you knew in Egypt, but he will inflict them on all who hate you. (Dt 7:15, NIV)





29 For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves. 30 That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep. (1 Cor 11:29-30, NIV)





19b Then Herod went from Judea to Caesarea and stayed there. 20 He had been quarreling with the people of Tyre and Sidon; they now joined together and sought an audience with him. After securing the support of Blastus, a trusted personal servant of the king, they asked for peace, because they depended on the king's country for their food supply. (Ac 12:19b-20, NIV)







- 21 On the appointed day Herod, wearing his royal robes, sat on his throne and delivered a public address to the people. 22 They shouted, "This is the voice of a god, not of a man."
- 23 Immediately, because Herod did not give praise to God, an angel of the Lord struck him down, and he was eaten by worms and died. (Ac 12:21-23, NIV)

Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned—

#### MARK 2:5 FORGIVENESS PRONOUNCED



He shall burn all the fat on the altar as he burned the fat of the fellowship offering. In this way the priest will make atonement for the leader's sin, and he will be forgiven. (Lev 4:26, NIV)



#### MARK 2:5 FORGIVENESS PRONOUNCED



Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD [YHWH]." Nathan replied, "The LORD [YHWH] has taken away your sin. You are not going to die. (2 Sam 12:13, NIV)

10 Now the son of an Israelite mother and an Egyptian father went out among the Israelites, and a fight broke out in the camp between him and an Israelite. 11 The son of the Israelite woman blasphemed the Name with a curse; so they brought him to Moses. (His mother's name was Shelomith, the daughter of Dibri the Danite.) 12 They put him in custody until the will of the LORD [YHWH] should be made clear to them. (Lev 24:10-12, NIV)





13 Then the LORD [YHWH] said to Moses: 14 "Take the blasphemer outside the camp. All those who heard him are to lay their hands on his head, and the entire assembly is to stone him. 15 Say to the Israelites: 'Anyone who curses their God will be held responsible; 16 anyone who blasphemes the name of the LORD [YHWH] is to be put to death. The entire assembly must stone them. Whether foreigner or native-born, when they blaspheme the Name they are to be **put to death**. (Lev 24:13-16, NIV)







And, straight away Jesus, having recognized in His spirit that they were debating within themselves in this way, He says to them, "Why do you debate these things in your heart?" (Mk 2:8, AT)



MARK 2:8 THE LORD KNOWS



### Before a word is on my tongue

you, LORD [YHWH], know it completely.

(Ps 139:4, NIV)







9 The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it? "10 I the LORD [YHWH] search the heart and examine the mind, to reward each person according to their conduct, according to what their deeds deserve." (Jer 17:9-10, NIV)



MARK 2:8 THE LORD KNOWS



7 But the LORD [YHWH] said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD [YHWH] does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD [YHWH] looks at the heart." (1 Sam 16:7, NIV)



### MARK 2:8 THE LORD KNOWS



38 and when a prayer or plea is made by anyone among your people Israel—being aware of the afflictions of their own hearts, and spreading out their hands toward this temple—39 then hear from heaven, your dwelling place. Forgive and act; deal with everyone according to all they do, since you know their hearts (for you alone know every human heart), (1 Ki 8:38-39, NIV)



MARK 2:9 WHAT'S EASIER?



Which is easier: to say to the paralyzed man, 'Your sins are forgiven' or to say, 'Rise and take up your mat and walk?' (Mk 2:9, AT)





But, so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority [έξουσία | exousia] to forgive sins on the earth..." (He [then] says to the paralyzed man): (Mk 2:10, AT)





what is mankind that you are mindful of them,

human beings [ בֶּרְ־אָּלָה | ben adam: lit. sons of man/Adam] that you care for them?

(Ps 8:4, NIV)





13 "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. 14 He was given authority [LXX: ἐξουσία | exousia], glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed. (Dn 7:13-14, NIV)





61b Again the high priest asked him, "Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?" 62 "I am," said Jesus. "And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and coming on the clouds of heaven." (Mk 14:61b-62, NIV)





63 The high priest tore his clothes. "Why do we need any more witnesses?" he asked. 64 "You have heard the **blasphemy**. What do you think?" They all condemned him as **worthy of death.** 

(Mk 14:63-64, NIV)





10 But, so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority to forgive sins on the earth..." (He [then] says to the paralyzed man) 11 "...to you, I say: Rise, take up your mat, and go home." 12 And he was raised and, straight away, having took up the mat, he went out in front of everyone. As a result, this caused everyone to be beside themselves and they glorified God saying, "We have never seen anything like this!" (Mk 2:10-12, AT)





Then will the **lame leap** like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy. Water will gush forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert.

(Is 35:6, NIV)





So he replied to the messengers, "Go back and report to John what you have seen and heard: The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. (Lk 7:22, NIV)





31 "The days are coming," declares the LORD [YHWH], "when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. 32 It will **not** be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them," declares the LORD [YHWH]. (Jer 31:31-32, NIV)





33 "This is the **covenant** I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the LORD [YHWH]. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. No longer will they teach their neighbor, or say to one another, 'Know the LORD [YHWH],' because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the LORD [YHWH]. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more." (Jer 31:33-34, NIV)





16 Then the LORD [YHWH] said to Moses, "Tell Aaron, 'Stretch out your staff and strike the dust of the ground,' and throughout the land of Egypt the dust will become gnats." 17 They did this, and when Aaron stretched out his hand with the staff and struck the dust of the ground, gnats came on people and animals. All the dust throughout the land of Egypt became gnats. (Ex 8:16-17, NIV)





18 But when the magicians tried to produce gnats by their secret arts, they could not.

Since the gnats were on people and animals everywhere, 19 the magicians said to Pharaoh, "This is **the finger of God.**" But Pharaoh's heart was hard and he would not listen, just as the

LORD [YHWH] had said. (Ex 8:18-19, NIV)
