2 CORINTHIANS 5:11-13 BIBLE STUDY SLIDES

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SINFUL SEPARATION



- 1 Surely the arm of the LORD [YHWH] is not too short to save, nor his ear too dull to hear.
- 2 But your iniquities have separated you from your God; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear. (Is 59:1-2, NIV)



SINFUL SEPARATION



Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. (Col 1:21, NIV)





Unlike so many, we do not peddle the word of God for profit. On the contrary, in Christ we speak before God with sincerity, as those sent from God. (2 Cor 2:17, NIV)





Rather, we have renounced secret and shameful ways; we do not use deception, nor do we distort the word of God. On the contrary, by setting forth the truth plainly we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. (2 Cor 4:2, NIV)





For if someone comes to you and preaches a Jesus other than the Jesus we preached, or if you receive a different spirit from the Spirit you received, or a different gospel from the one you accepted, you put up with it easily enough. (2 Cor 11:4, NIV)





For such people are false apostles, deceitful workers, masquerading as apostles of Christ. (2 Cor 11:13)





Since, therefore, having known the fear of the Lord, we try to persuade $[\pi \epsilon i\theta \omega \mid peith\bar{o}]$ people. But, to God, what we are has been clearly revealed. And, I hope it to be clearly revealed in your consciences, as well. (2 Cor 5:11, AT)





So we make it our goal to please him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. (2 Cor 5:9, NIV)





For we must **all** appear before the **judgment** seat of Christ, so that **each** of us may receive what is due us for the things done while in the body, whether **good** or **bad** (2 Cor 5:10, NIV)





And now, Israel, what does the LORD [YHWH] your God ask of you but to fear the LORD [YHWH] your God, to walk in obedience to him, to love him, to serve the LORD [YHWH] your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to observe the LORD [YHWH]'s commands and decrees that I am giving you today for your own good? (Dt 10:12-13, NIV)





The fear of the LORD [YHWH] is the beginning of knowledge, but wisdom and discipline fools despise.

(Pr 1:7, AT; cf. Pr 9:10)





Am I now trying to win the approval [πείθω | peithō] of human beings, or of God? Or am I trying to please people? If I were still trying to please people, I would not be a servant of Christ. (Gal 1:10, NIV)





We demolish **arguments** and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ. (2 Cor 10:5, NIV)





8 Paul entered the synagogue and spoke boldly there for three months, arguing persuasively $[\pi \varepsilon i\theta \omega \mid peith\bar{o}]$ about the kingdom of God. 9 But some of them became obstinate; they refused to believe and publicly maligned the Way. So Paul left them. He took the disciples with him and had discussions daily in the lecture hall of Tyrannus. 10 This went on for two years, so that all the Jews and Greeks who lived in the province of Asia heard the word of the Lord. (Ac 19:8-10, NIV)





2 As was his custom, Paul went into the synagogue, and on three Sabbath days he reasoned with them from the Scriptures, 3 explaining and proving that the Messiah had to suffer and rise from the dead. "This Jesus I am proclaiming to you is the Messiah," he said. 4 Some of the Jews were persuaded $[\pi \varepsilon i\theta \omega \mid peith\bar{o}]$ and joined Paul and Silas, as did a large number of God-fearing Greeks and quite a few prominent women. (Ac 17:2-4, NIV)





5 I do not think I am in the least inferior to those "super-apostles." 6 I may indeed be untrained as a speaker, but I do have knowledge. We have made this perfectly clear to you in every way. (2 Cor 11:5-6, NIV)





1 And so it was with me, brothers and sisters. When I came to you, I did not come with eloquence or human wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. 2 For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. 3 I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. 4 My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words $[\pi \epsilon i\theta \omega \mid peith\bar{o}]$, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, 5 so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on God's power. (1 Cor 2:1-5, NIV)





Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death.

(2 Cor 7:10, NIV)





We are not commending ourselves to you again, but giving you an opportunity to boast because of us, so that you may have [something to say to] those who boast before you in appearances [πρόσωπον | prosopon] and not in heart. (2 Cor 5:12, AT)





Let someone **else** praise you, and not your own **mouth**; an outsider, and not your own **lips**. (Pr 27:2, NIV)





23 This is what the LORD [YHWH] says: "Let not the wise boast of their **wisdom** or the strong boast of their **strength** or the rich boast of their **riches**, 24 but let the one who boasts boast about this: **that they have the understanding to know me**, that I am the LORD [YHWH], who exercises kindness, justice and righteousness on earth, for in these I delight," declares the LORD [YHWH]. (Jer 9:23-24, NIV)





Therefore, as it is written: "Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord." (1 Cor 1:31, NIV)





17 But, "Let the one who boasts **boast in the**Lord." 18 For it is not the one who commends
himself who is approved, but the one whom the
Lord commends. (2 Cor 10:17-18, NIV)





You are judging by **appearances** [$\pi\rho\delta\sigma\omega\pi$ ov | $pros\bar{o}pon$]. If anyone is confident that they belong to Christ, they should consider again that we belong to Christ just as much as they do.

(2 Cor 10:7, NIV)





Stop judging by mere appearances, but instead judge correctly. (Jn 7:24, NIV)





But the LORD [YHWH] said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD [YHWH] does not look at the things people look at.

People look at the **outward appearance** [πρόσωπον | *prosōpon*], but the LORD [YHWH] looks at the **heart**." (1 Sam 16:7, NIV)





Whatever anyone else dares to **boast** about—I am speaking as a fool—I also dare to **boast** about. 22 Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they Abraham's descendants? So am I. 23 Are they servants of Christ? (I am out of my mind to talk like this.) I am more. I have worked much harder, been in prison more frequently, been flogged more severely, and been exposed to death again and again. (2 Cor 11:21b-23, NIV)





24 Five times I received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. 25 Three times I was beaten with rods, once I was pelted with stones, three times I was shipwrecked, I spent a night and a day in the open sea, 26 I have been constantly on the move. I have been in danger from rivers, in danger from bandits, in danger from my fellow Jews, in danger from Gentiles; in danger in the city, in danger in the country, in

danger at sea; and in danger from false believers. (2 Cor 11:24-26, NIV)





27 I have labored and toiled and have often gone without sleep; I have known hunger and thirst and have often gone without food; I have been cold and naked.

28 Besides everything else, I face daily the **pressure of** my concern for all the churches. (2 Cor 11:27-28, NIV)





For if we were out of our mind [έξίστημι | existēmi], it was for God. If we were in our right mind, it was for you. (2 Cor 5:13, AT)





When his family heard about this, they went to take charge of him, for they said, "He is out of his mind [έξίστημι | existēmi]." (Mk 3:21, NIV; cf. Jn 10:20)





19 "So then, King Agrippa, I was not disobedient to the vision from heaven. 20 First to those in Damascus, then to those in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and then to the Gentiles, I preached that they should repent and turn to God and demonstrate their repentance by their deeds. 21 That is why some Jews seized me in the temple courts and tried to kill me. (Ac 26:19-21, NIV)





22 But God has helped me to this very day; so I stand here and testify to small and great alike. I am saying nothing beyond what the prophets and Moses said would happen— 23 that the Messiah would suffer and, as the first to rise from the dead, would bring the message of light to his own people and to the Gentiles." (Ac 26:22-23, NIV)





- 24 At this point Festus interrupted Paul's defense. "You are **out of your mind**, Paul!" he shouted. "Your great learning is driving you insane."
- 25 "I am not insane, most excellent Festus," Paul replied. "What I am saying is **true** and **reasonable**. (Ac 26:24-25, NIV)
