Then he said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. (Lk 9:23, NIV)

THE WAY OF
THE CROSS



As the soldiers led him away, they seized Simon from Cyrene, who was on his way in from the country, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus. (Lk 23:26, NIV)





33 The child's father and mother marveled at what was said about him. 34 Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, 35 so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too." (Lk 2:33-35, NIV)





And he said, "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life." (Lk 9:22, NIV)





30 Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendor, talking with Jesus. 31 They spoke about his departure [ἔξοδος | exhodos], which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem (Lk 9:30-31, NIV)





31 Jesus took the Twelve aside and told them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled. 32 He will be delivered over to the Gentiles. They will mock him, insult him and spit on him; 33 they will flog him and kill him. On the third day he will rise again." (Lk 18:31-33, NIV; cf. Lk 17:25)





13 "In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. 14 He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all nations and peoples of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed. (Dn 7:13-14, NIV)





Again the high priest asked him, "Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?"

62 "I am," said Jesus. "And you will see the **Son of Man** sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and **coming on the clouds of heaven.**" (Mk 14:61b-62, NIV)





63 The high priest tore his clothes. "Why do we need any more witnesses?" he asked. 64 "You have heard the **blasphemy**. What do you think?"

They all **condemned him as worthy of death**. 65 Then some began to **spit** at him; they **blindfolded** him, **struck** him with their fists, and said, "Prophesy!" And the guards took him and **beat** him. (Mk 14:63-65, NIV)





A large number of people **followed** him, including women who mourned and wailed for him. (Lk 23:27, NIV)





Then two others – criminals – were also being taken away [to be executed] with Him. (Lk 23:32, AT)





It is written: 'And he was numbered with the transgressors'; and I tell you that this must be fulfilled in me. Yes, what is written about me is reaching its fulfillment." (Lk 22:37, NIV)





Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong, because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors.

For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

(Is 53:12, NIV)





But he was **pierced** for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. (Is 53:5, NIV)





5 For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, 6 who gave himself as a ransom for all people. This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. (1 Tim 2:5-6, NIV)







And when they came to the place called Skull [i.e., Golgatha], there they crucified Him and the criminals – one who was on the right, and [one] who was on the left. (Lk 23:33, AT)





But Jesus was saying, "Father, forgive them, because they do not know what they are doing." Then they cast lots and divided His clothing among themselves. (Lk 23:34, AT)





Then he fell on his knees and cried out, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." When he had said this, he fell asleep. (Ac 7:60, NIV)





"My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their [the disciples] message, (Jn 17:20, NIV)





47 "The servant who knows the master's will and does not get ready or does not do what the master wants will be beaten with many blows. 48 But the one who does not know and does things deserving punishment will be beaten with few blows. From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked. (Lk 12:48, NIV)





1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Why are you so far from saving me, so far from my cries of anguish?

2 My God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer,

by night, but I find no rest. (Ps 22:1-2, NIV)







And at three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "*Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani*?" (which means "**My God, my God, why have you forsaken me**?"). (Mk 15:34, NIV)





- 3 Yet you are enthroned as the Holy One; you are the one Israel praises.
- 4 In you our ancestors put their trust; they trusted and you delivered them.
- 5 To you they cried out and were saved; in you they trusted and were not put to shame.

(Ps 22:3-5, NIV)





- 6 But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by everyone, despised by the people.
- 7 All who see [LXX: θεωρέω | theōreō] me mock [LXX: ἐκμυκτηρίζω | ekmyktērizō] me; they hurl insults, shaking their heads.
- 8 "He trusts in the LORD [YHWH]," they say, "let the LORD [YHWH] rescue him.
 - Let him **deliver** [LXX: $\sigma \phi \zeta \omega \mid s \bar{o} z \bar{o}$] him, since he delights in him."

(Ps 22:6-8, NIV)





- 9 Yet you brought me out of the womb; you made me **trust** in you, even at my mother's breast.
- 10 From birth I was cast on you; from my mother's womb you have been my God.
- 11 Do not be far from me,

 for trouble is near

 and there is no one to help.

(Ps 22:9-11, NIV)





- 12 Many bulls surround me; strong bulls of Bashan encircle me.
- 13 Roaring lions that tear their prey open their mouths wide against me.
- (Ps 22:12-13, NIV)





14 I am poured out like water,

and all my bones are out of joint.

My heart has turned to wax; it has melted within me.

15 My mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death.

(Ps 22:14-15, NIV)





Later, knowing that everything had now been finished, and so that Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." (Jn 19:28, NIV)





- 16 Dogs surround me,
 - a pack of villains encircles me; they pierce my hands and my feet.
- 17 All my bones are on display; people stare and gloat over me.
- 18 They divide my clothes among them and cast lots for my garment.

(Ps 22:16-18, NIV)





- 19 But you, LORD [YHWH], do not be far from me. You are my strength; come quickly to help me.
- 20 Deliver me from the sword, my precious life from the power of the dogs.
- 21 Rescue me from the mouth of the lions; save me from the horns of the wild oxen.

(Ps 22:19-21, NIV)





- 22 I will declare your name to my people; in the assembly I will praise you.
- You who fear the LORD [YHWH], praise him!
 All you descendants of Jacob, honor him!
 Revere him, all you descendants of Israel!
- 24 For he has **not despised** or **scorned** the suffering of the afflicted one; he has **not** hidden his face from him but has listened to his cry for help.

(Ps 22:22-24, NIV)





- 25 From you comes the theme of my praise in the great assembly; before those who fear you I will fulfill my vows.
- 26 The poor will eat and be satisfied; those who seek the LORD [YHWH] will praise him—may your hearts live forever!

(Ps 22:25-26, NIV)





- 27 All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the LORD [YHWH], and all the families of the nations will bow down before him,
 28 for dominion belongs to the LORD [YHWH] and he rules over the nations.
- (Ps 22:27-28, NIV)





- 29 All the rich of the earth will feast and worship; all who go down to the dust will kneel before him—those who cannot keep themselves alive.
- 30 Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord.
- 31 They will proclaim his righteousness, declaring to a people yet unborn:

 He has done it!

(Ps 22:29-31, NIV)





When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished."... (Jn 19:30a, NIV)






21 Rescue me [A] from the mouth of the lions [B]; save me [A'] from the horns of the wild oxen [B'].

22 I will declare your name [A] to my people [B]; in the assembly [B'] I will praise you [A'].

(Ps 22:22, NIV)





- A) The leaders mock, "Let him save himself, if this one is God's Messiah" (23:35b)
 - B The soldiers mock, "If you are the king of the Jews" (23:36–37)
 - B' The titulus announcing: "This one is the king of the Jews" (23:38)
- A') One evildoer taunts: "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us" (23:39)

LUKE 23:35 SAVE YOURSELF!



And the people stood there **watching** [θεωρέω | *theōreō*]. But, the [Jewish] leaders were **ridiculing** [ἐκμυκτηρίζω | $ekmykt\bar{e}riz\bar{o}$] and saying, "He **saved** [σϕζω | $s\bar{o}z\bar{o}$] others; He should **save** [σϕζω | $s\bar{o}z\bar{o}$] Himself – if He is God's Messiah [Christ], the Chosen One!" (Lk 23:35, AT)

Those who had seen it told the people how the demon-possessed man had been **cured** $[\sigma \phi \zeta \omega \mid s\bar{o}z\bar{o}]$.

(Lk 8:36, NIV)

Then he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has **healed** [$\sigma \phi \zeta \omega \mid s \bar{o} z \bar{o}$] you. Go in peace." (Lk 8:48, NIV)







36 And the soldiers also mocked Him, coming up to Him, offering Him wine vinegar [$\delta\xi_{0}$ | oxos] 37 and saying, "If You are the King of the Jews, save Yourself!" (Lk 23:36-37, AT)







They put gall in my food and gave me **vinegar** [LXX: $\delta\xi o\zeta \mid oxos$] for my thirst.

(Ps 69:21, NIV)

And there was also an inscription above Him: "This is the King of the Jews". (Lk 23:38, AT)

Many of the Jews read this sign, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and the sign was written in Aramaic, Latin and Greek. (Jn 19:20, NIV)



LUKE 23:38 IRONIC INSCRIPTION



- 32 He will be great, and will be called Son of the Most High.

 And the Lord God will give Him the **throne** of His forefather. **David**
- And the Lord God will give Him the throne of His forefather, David.
- 33 And He will **reign** over the house of Jacob forever, and of His **Kingdom** there will be no end.

(Lk 1:32-33, AT)



LUKE 23:39 LOOK WHO'S TALKIN'!



One of the criminals who were hung was slandering Him saying, "Aren't you the Messiah? Save Yourself and us!" (Lk 23:39, AT)




LUKE 23:40-41 CHANGE OF HEART



40 But the other [criminal] answered and rebuked him saying, "Don't you fear God, since you are [under] the same sentence of condemnation?" 41 And we, indeed, justly [are condemned]; we are getting back things we deserve because of what we did. But this man did nothing wrong. (Lk 23:40-41, AT)







13 Pilate called together the chief priests, the rulers and the people, 14 and said to them, "You brought me this man as one who was inciting the people to rebellion. I have examined him in your presence and have found no basis for your charges against him. 15 Neither has Herod, for he sent him back to us; as you can see, he has done nothing to deserve death. (Lk 23:13-15, NIV)



LUKE 23:40-41 CHANGE OF HEART



In the same way the rebels who were crucified with him also heaped insults on him. (Mt 27:44, NIV)

Those crucified with him also heaped insults on him.

(Mk 15:32b, NIV)




LUKE 23:42 THE APPEAL OF FAITH



And he was saying, "Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom!" (Lk 23:42, AT)







Remember me, LORD [YHWH], when you show favor to your people, come to my aid when you save them, (Ps 106:4, NIV)



LUKE 23:42 THE APPEAL OF FAITH



But when all goes well with you, remember me and show me kindness; mention me to Pharaoh and get me out of this prison. (Gen 40:14, NIV)



LUKE 23:43 MORE THAN HE ASKED OR IMAGINED



Then He answered him, "Truly [lit. Amen], I say to you, today you will be with Me in paradise." (Lk 23:43, AT)



LUKE 23:43 MORETHAN HE ASKED OR IMAGINED



Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the **tree of life**, which is in the **paradise of God**.

(Rev 2:7, NIV; cf. Ezek 31:8; 2 Cor 12:4)
